THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—YEAR B 3RD NOVEMBER 2024

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Hear Israel, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 17:2-4. 47. 51. R.v.2

(R.) I love you Lord, my strength.

I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour.
My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold.
The Lord is worthy of all praise:
when I call I am saved from my foes. (R.)

Long life to the Lord, my rock! Praised be to the God that saves me. He has given great victories to his king and shown love for his anointed. (R.)

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

This one, because he remains for ever, has an eternal priesthood.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!
All who love me will keep my words,
and my Father will love them and we will come to them.
Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 12:28-34

This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.



REFLECTION by Greg Sunter

Generally, in the gospels, the scribes are shown as antagonistic towards Jesus and when we begin this passage we may be expecting a trap being laid by the scribe. In Jewish tradition, a lot of teaching occurs through a question and answer style and often the question is related to a particular teaching from Torah. Here, the scribe approaches Jesus as a teacher, a rabbi, and poses a question just as he would to any other worthy teacher. He asks which of the commandments Jesus regards to be foremost. This could be an opening question to any teacher and one would expect it to be the start of a long conversation. Neither of the commandments Jesus quotes come from the Ten Commandments with which we are most familiar, but, rather, they come from other parts of Torah (the Law). His qualification of the first commandment – to love God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength – is a way of capturing the whole person. What Jesus is saying is to love God completely and utterly with your whole person. Then he follows up and adds another commandment -'You must love your neighbour as yourself.' The scribe agrees with Jesus' teaching and adds that these are far more important than offering sacrifice. This is a pretty controversial statement from a scribe! Sacrifice has been the official form of prayer practised in the Temple for a very long time and he suggests that love of God and love of neighbour are far more important! It is because of this understanding about the priority of love over religious practice the hallmark of the kingdom of God that Jesus proclaims - that Jesus pronounces the scribe to be 'not far from the kingdom of God.'

Youth Reflection by Lisa-Marie Calderone-Stewart

R-e-s-p-e-c-t

A major theme of the Scripture readings is 'Love God and your neighbour'.

These readings challenge us to put our love for God first, then to spread that love to our neighbours. In Deuteronomy, Moses tells the people that fear of the Lord and love of the Lord are a recipe for a long, prosperous life. Moses makes it clear that just following the Law is not enough. The Law is to be followed as an expression of love for God and neighbour. It takes one's entire being — heart, soul and strength — to truly love God.

The psalmist sees loving God as the source of strength and safety. God is strong and unmovable, a rock to hide behind, where we will be safe from our enemies, in whatever form they threaten us.


The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews continues the theme of God's love revealed and given in Jesus, who goes to the Father on our behalf like a great high priest. The writer of Hebrews takes great pains to explain that Jesus is not like the other high priests. His sacrifice is once and for all. He is holy, innocent, undefiled, and higher than the heavens.

The reading from Mark opens with the Pharisees using questions to set a trap for Jesus. They ask Jesus which commandment is the most important. Jesus responds by quoting Deuteronomy, which says that God is God alone and we are to love God with our entire being. Then Jesus adds a second important commandment: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' Jesus' view of the Commandments is that they are specifications of the great commandment to love God and our neighbour — that if we obey the Commandments we are, in fact, loving God and our neighbour. The Pharisee recognises that love of God, self and neighbour are more important to God than empty rituals and blind obedience to laws.

Christian Initiation: The Rite of Enrolment of Names

On Saturday, 9th November, during the Vigil Mass, we will have the Rite of Enrolment of Names. Please keep our catechumen, Kate in our prayers during this time.

The second step in Christian initiation is the liturgical rite called both election and the enrolment of names, which closes the period of the catechumenate proper, that is, the lengthy period of formation of the catechumens' minds and hearts. The celebration of the rite of election also marks the beginning of the period of final, more intense preparation for the sacraments of initiation, during which the elect will be encouraged to follow Christ with greater generosity .
